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Noah's Ark (Genesis 6-9)

Hi, friend!

We had a great time learning that God wants us to obey! Today we heard the Bible story of Noah and the ark. Noah obeyed God by building the ark, putting the animals in the ark, and bringing his family into the ark. Remember that God wants us to obey. Enjoy the fun activity below.

Family Activity: Obeying

- Read the story of Noah from a children's Bible (such as *The Beginner's Bible*) to your child (Genesis 6-9).
- 2 Talk with your child about how Noah obeyed God.
- Invite your child to play a game with you. Say, "I will tell you what to do. Let's play a fun game to practice obeying."
- Play Simon Says with your child. Tell your child that "Simon says":
 - a. Sit down
 - b. Stand up
 - c. Jump up and down
 - d. Touch your toes
 - e. Spin around
 - f. Touch your elbows
 - g. Touch your head



- Say, "God wants us to obey. We just played a game to practice obeying. What are some ways you can obey?" (Picking up toys, listening to the babysitter, eating all the food on the plate, etc.)
- **6** Throughout the week, compliment your child on different times they choose to obey.
- Together, repeat the truth of the day with the motions that your child learned. "God (*point up*) wants us to obey (*thumbs up*)."
- **③** Pray with your child and ask God to help him or her obey.



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Story Point: Jesus taught that we must be born again.

Big Picture Question: What makes people special? People are special because we are made in God's image, as male and female, to know Him.

Christ Connection: Nicodemus needed new life—eternal life—but he could not do anything to earn it. Eternal life is a gift that comes only from God. God showed His love in this way: He sent His one and only Son to save the world. Everyone who believes in Him will not perish but will have eternal life.

Jesus and Nicodemus

John 3

STORY POINT: JESUS TAUGHT THAT WE MUST BE BORN AGAIN.

One night, a religious man came to see Jesus. The man's name was Nicodemus. Nicodemus wanted to know more about Jesus. "Rabbi," he said, "we know that You are a teacher who has come from God. No one could do the miracles You do unless God were with him."

Jesus said, "I tell you: Unless someone is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."

Now Nicodemus was confused. "How can anyone be born when he is old?" Nicodemus asked.

Jesus said, "A person cannot enter God's kingdom unless he is born of water and the Spirit." When a baby is born, he gets physical life from his parents. Physical life doesn't last forever. But the Spirit gives people a better kind of life—spiritual life—so they can live with God forever. Jesus said, "Don't be surprised I told you that you must be born again." Nicodemus still didn't understand.

"How is this possible?" he asked. Jesus said, "Do you remember how Moses raised up the bronze snake in the wilderness? Everyone who looked at it was healed. Like that, the Son of Man will be raised up, so that everyone who believes in Him will have eternal life."

Then Jesus said, "God loved the world in this way: He gave His one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life."

Activity 1: Story Discussion/Application Activity

What to do: Read Acts 19:1-12

- How did Paul get to Ephesus? (A road "through the interior"—by land, not by boat.) What did Paul ask the group of disciples he met in Ephesus? (Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?) Had they even heard of the Holy Spirit? (No!) What baptism had these believers received? (John's baptism.) How did Paul describe John's baptism? (As a baptism of repentance.) Who was it that John told people to believe in? (Jesus.) What happened when the believers were baptized in Jesus' name? (They spoke in tongues and prophesied.) How many men were there? (12.)
- 2) How long did Paul speak in the synagogue? (Three months.) How did some people respond? (Became obstinate; publicly maligned the Way.) Where did Paul start having discussions instead of the synagogue? (The Lecture hall of Tyrannus.) How long did he do this? (Two years.) How many people heard about Jesus? (All the Jews and Greeks who lived in Asia! [Note: In the Roman empire, this was the western part of where Turkey is now—not the whole continent.]) What kinds of miracles did God do through Paul? (People were healed when they received handkerchiefs or aprons Paul had touched.)

Activity 2: Roles of the Trinity

Give kids a sheet (on the following page) that lists different roles of the Trinity. They can match each of the roles to one of the persons of the Trinity by drawing a line between them. If they're not sure about a particular role, you can discuss as a group and then look up the verse that goes with it to make sure.

Say: In today's lesson, we learned about some of the things the Spirit can do in the lives of believers. Since the Father, Son, and Spirit are one God, there is overlap in their traits. God wasn't created and has always been, and is all-powerful and all-knowing. This means that this is true of Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. But we do see in Scripture that they perform different roles throughout history.

Activity 3: Share prayer requests and spend time praying together.

If you still have time after completing the activities, work on the following:

- memorizing the memory verse
- working on Day 1 of the take-home devotion
- review the books of the Bible
- retelling today's Bible story
